#### Candlewood Knolls Golf Cart Guidelines

- Golf Cart Guidelines: In an effort to promote safety and security for our residents, the Board of Directors inaugurated the following guidelines:
  - Golf carts must have headlights and reflective tape affixed to the rear of the cart if they are going to be used after dark,
  - Drivers must be 16 years of age to drive a Golf Cart or 15 years of age with a valid learner permit.
  - Golf Cart capacity is limited to the available seating on each respective Golf Cart,
  - d. Driving rules for Golf Carts are consistent with the general rules of the road. This includes abiding by stop signs, yielding right of way, staying to the right side of the road, etc. It is the responsibility of the driver to know and follow the rules of the road.
  - e. Liability Insurance is available for Golf Carts and the Board of Directors highly recommends you have this coverage on your personal golf cart.
- Golf Cart/Community Property: Please note that golf carts should not be driven on the beaches, ball field, and clubhouse lawn

















# AROUND THE TOWN

# The Family Picnic – 50 Years of Food & Fun by Denise Fucito

As we celebrate 50 years of the Family Picnic tomorrow, it is a great time to reflect on its origin. I had the privilege of chatting with neighbor Dora Cassety who provided me with in-depth information.

In 1974, there had been ongoing conflict regarding the basketball & tennis courts. Adrian Lumelleau was President at the time, and during a community meeting there was a continued discussion about moving the basketball hoop off the tennis courts. Dora raised her hand and volunteered to head a committee to get this done. Tess Kawejsza and Ed Sczepanski joined the committee, along with a few others, as she and her husband, Hal, came up with the scheme for the Family Picnic. It was an all-volunteer effort with the North (cottage section) bringing desserts and the South (cabin section) bringing salads and cold sides; board members and volunteer cooks prepared corn, hamburgers, hotdogs, and chicken. Dora recalls there were many gallons of chicken broth that resulted from the par boiling the night before the picnic. In six weeks, they had the basketball hoop moved - which made everyone happy - and a new tradition was started that brought much needed attention to the clubhouse.

Over the years, the picnic has had a wide variety of changes to the format and menu. Dora does not recall when they began selling T-shirts, but Hal designed the ones displayed in the clubhouse along with the distinctive logo (which has disappeared and changed several times). Raffle prizes were donated and up until 2001, the picnic was held on the waterfront property of the clubhouse - when the grounds were not level and tables were tilted. And let's not forget those beer trucks (filled with beer) donated by the Luberger family.

I served on the Board in the late 90s-early 2000s and introduced the volleyball tournament in 1999 on the ballfield and the dunking machine on the field in 2000. Let's just say some people embrace change, others do not. Then in 2001, when Jay Becker was President, the Family Picnic was moved to the ballfield, lunch was added, and a slew of activities were incorporated into the day (which included ribbons and medals). A separate raffle for children was added. That year I was responsible for soliciting adult raffle prizes (back then -mostly from vendors in New Fairfield) and the t-shirt design (not my forte - it was lame). Since then, I have worked alongside Florence in coordinating lunch service and assisting with dinner. My scariest memory is the year we had almost 700 people attend. I remember looking at the food line and thinking of that scene from the movie Jaws - "You're gonna need a bigger boat!" It was like Field of Dreams (more like a nightmare) but Florence ordered enough food and we managed to feed everyone and survive the day. In 2017, the Lynch family held their reunion at the picnic in celebration of tMary Lynch's 95th birthday. This year you will see a large group of Keenan family members in matching T-shirts.

So, 50 years later we will serve lunch and dinner, have a children and adult raffle drawing, sell T-shirts, and run a marathon of activities, including the famous North v. South Tug of War. It is still an event run by the Board and dependent on lots of volunteers. Regardless of all the changes through the years, the Candlewood Knolls Family Picnic is more than just an event; it is a testament to the enduring spirit of community and the importance of shared traditions. As new generations join the festivities, the picnic continues to be a beloved occasion, embodying the warmth and camaraderie that defines Candlewood Knolls. Hope to see you there!
